# Chapter 1 Introduction

#### Overview

The ATEN VC1280 is a user-friendly device that simply connects HDMI and VGA sources to one HDMI display or projector. Apart from being compliant with HDCP 1.4, the VC1280 also supports HDMI including 3D, Deep Color and 4K (3840 X 2160@30 Hz). In addition, the VC1280 features built-in VGA conversion, which allows you to transmit VGA signals to HDMI output without using extra adapters or scalers.

The VC1280 offers three source switching modes – HDMI, VGA, and AUTO, it allows you to switch rapidly and intuitively via a pushbutton for real-time use. When the VC1280 operates on the AUTO input mode, it transmits the first detected input to the HDMI display, and automatically switches to a newly plugged-in source when it detects the signals.

Without any software or driver installation required, the VC1280 is a handy and easy-to-use multi-input A/V switch. It is deal for user that needs automatic and quick switching to adopt. With the VC1280, you can effortlessly accelerate instant collaboration and work efficiency with co-workers.


## Components

## **Front View**



No.	Component	Description					
1	HDMI In Port	Connects to the HDMI Out port on the source device.					
2	VGA In Port	Connects to the VGA Out port on the source device.					
3	Audio In Port	Connects to the Audio Out port on the source device.					
4	Source Switch Pushbutton	Press to switch among the Auto Switch, HDMI, and VGA input mode. The input mode status is indicated by the three LEDs to the right of this pushbutton. For details, see <i>Top View</i> , page 6.					
5	Auto LED	When LED lights orange, it means the VC1280 is in Auto mode. For more details, see <i>Source Input Operation</i> , page 9.					
6	HDMI LED	When LED lights orange, it means the VC1280 is in HDMI mode. For more details, see <i>Source Input Operation</i> , page 9.					
7	VGA LED	When LED lights orange, it means the VC1280 is in VGA mode. For more details, see <i>Source Input Operation</i> , page 9.					

## **Rear View**



No.	Component	Description
1	HDMI Out Port	Connects to the HDMI In port on the display device.
2	RS-232 Port	Connects to an RS-232 main controller, such as a PC or Control system.
3	Power Jack	Connects to the Power Adapter.

## **Top View**

You can find the unit's LEDs on the top and front panel as illustrated below. See the table below for details on LED indication.



No.	LED	Indication	Description
1	VGA Input Status LED	Lights green	The VGA signal is stable.
2	HDMI Input Status LED	Lights green	The HDMI signal is stable.
3	Power LED	Lights green	The unit is receiving power.

#### Note:

 The Power and Link LED blink at the same time to indicate that the firmware upgrade is in progress.



## Mounting the VC1280 Unit

You can mount the VC1280 to the wall or on a rack.

## **Wall Mounting**

Secure or hang the VC1280 unit to the wall using the built-in mounting brackets.



## **Rack Mounting**

## Connecting the VC1280 Unit

Follow the steps below to connect the VC1280 to a source, and other controls as required.



- 1. Connect the HDMI In Port on the VC1280 to the HDMI Out Port on your video source device using an HDMI cable.
- 2. Connect the VGA In Port on the VC1280 to the VGA Out Port on your video source device using a VGA cable. To transmit audio, connect the Audio In Port on your VC1280 to the Audio Jack from your video source.
- 3. Connect the HDMI Out Port on the VC1280 to the HDMI In Port on your HDMI display/projector using an HDMI cable.
- 4. (Optional) For RS-232 serial transmission and source switch control via RS-232 commands, connect your computer or control system to the terminal block on the VC1280.
- 5. Plug the power adapter cable into the Power Jack on the VC1280.

# Chapter 3 Operation

## **Selecting the Input Mode**


## **Source Input Operation**

Press the Source Switch Pushbutton on the VC1280 to switch between different input modes - Auto, HDMI, and VGA mode. Refer to the table below for details.

Input Mode	Description
Auto (Default)	The VC1280:
	<ul> <li>Prioritizes HDMI transmission if both HDMI In and VGA In ports are plugged in at the same time.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>Automatically switches to a newly detected input to the connected receiver.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>Automatically switches to the remaining port when one of the HDMI / VGA In ports is unplugged.</li> </ul>
	<b>Note:</b> You can disable this part of the Auto Switch mode (automatic input switching) using an RS-232 command. For more details, see <i>RS-232 Commands</i> , page 10.
HDMI	The VC1280 only transmits HDMI source to the connected
(LED lights orange)	receiver.
VGA	The VC1280 only transmits VGA source and its audio input to
(LED lights orange)	the connected receiver.

#### **Source Switch Pushbutton**

Press the **Source Switch Pushbutton** located on the front panel to switch among the Auto Switch, HDMI, and VGA input mode.



#### **RS-232 Commands**

You can change the input mode using RS-232 commands. Refer to the table below for a list of available tasks and the corresponding commands.

Type the corresponding command to execute a task. For example, to enable automatic switching, type **swmode next** and then press [Enter].

- Press [Enter] to execute a command.
- The current input mode setting is also indicated by the Auto Switch, HDMI, and VGA LEDs.

# Chapter 4 The Firmware Upgrade Utility

#### Introduction

The purpose of the Windows-based Firmware Upgrade Utility is to provide an easy process for upgrading the VC1280. The program comes as part of a Firmware Upgrade Package that is specific for each device.

As new firmware versions become available, new firmware upgrade packages are posted on our website. Check the website regularly to find the latest information and packages.

#### **Downloading the Firmware Upgrade Package**


To download the firmware upgrade package:

- 1. On our Website go to: *Download Firmware* and choose the device model, or from the VC1280 product page under the *Resources* tab, select *Firmware*. A list of available firmware upgrade packages appears.
- 2. Choose the firmware upgrade package that you wish to install (usually the most recent) and download it to your computer.

## **Preparation**

To prepare for the firmware upgrade, do the following:

1. Use an RS-232 cable to connect a COM port on your computer to the *RS-232 Serial Port* of your VC1280 using the RS-232 Terminal Block provided in the package.




- 2. Unplug the VC1280's power adapter.
- 3. Press the Source Switch Pushbutton and plug the power adapter into the VC1280 to power the unit.
- 4. If successful, the Status LEDs that indicates the VGA, HDMI, and power status will start to flash. Now, you can start the upgrade process as explained on the next page.

## Starting the Upgrade

To upgrade the firmware:


1. Run the downloaded firmware upgrade package file either by doubleclicking the file icon, or by opening a command line and entering the full path to it.

The Firmware Upgrade Utility welcome screen appears:




Note: The screens shown in this section are for reference only. The wording and layout of the actual screens put up by the *Firmware Upgrade Utility* may vary slightly from these examples.

- 2. Read and Agree to the License Agreement (click the I Agree radio button).
- 3. Click **Next** to continue. The *Firmware Upgrade Utility* main screen appears. The devices capable of being upgraded are listed in the *Device List* panel:



4. Click **Next** to perform the upgrade. The Status LEDs VGA, HDMI, and power will flash while the upgrade is in process.

If you enabled *Check Firmware Version*, the Utility compares the device's firmware level with that of the upgrade files. If it finds that the device's version is higher than the upgrade version, it brings up a dialog box informing you of the situation and gives you the option to continue or cancel.




If you didn't enable *Check Firmware Version*, the Utility installs the upgrade files without checking whether they are a higher level, or not.

Status messages appear in the *Status Messages* panel, and the progress toward completion is shown on the *Progress* bar.

## **Upgrade Succeeded**

After the upgrade has completed, all port LEDs will stop flashing and a screen appears to inform you that the procedure was successful:



Click Finish to close the Firmware Upgrade Utility.

## **Upgrade Failed**

If the *Upgrade Succeeded* screen doesn't appear, it means that the upgrade failed to complete successfully. See the next section, *Firmware Upgrade Recovery*, for how to proceed.

## Firmware Upgrade Recovery

There are three conditions that call for firmware upgrade recovery:

- When a firmware upgrade is manually aborted.
- When the mainboard firmware upgrade fails.
- When the I/O firmware upgrade fails.

To perform a firmware upgrade recovery, do the following:

- 1. Power off the device.
- 2. Connect the RS-232 cable to the RS-232 Serial Port.
- 3. Repeat the upgrade procedure.

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## **Appendix**

## **Safety Instructions**

#### General

- This product is for indoor use only.
- Read all of these instructions. Save them for future reference.
- Follow all warnings and instructions marked on the device.
- Do not place the device on any unstable surface (cart, stand, table, etc.). If the device falls, serious damage will result.
- Do not use the device near water.
- Do not place the device near, or over, radiators or heat registers.
- The device cabinet is provided with slots and openings to allow for adequate ventilation. To ensure reliable operation, and to protect against overheating, these openings must never be blocked or covered.
- The device should never be placed on a soft surface (bed, sofa, rug, etc.) as
  this will block its ventilation openings. Likewise, the device should not be
  placed in a built in enclosure unless adequate ventilation has been provided.
- Never spill liquid of any kind on the device.
- Unplug the device from the wall outlet before cleaning. Do not use liquid or aerosol cleaners. Use a damp cloth for cleaning.
- The device should be operated from the type of power source indicated on the marking label. If you are not sure of the type of power available, consult your dealer or local power company.
- To prevent damage to your installation it is important that all devices are properly grounded.
- Do not allow anything to rest on the power cord or cables. Route the power cord and cables so that they cannot be stepped on or tripped over.
- Position system cables and power cables carefully; Be sure that nothing rests on any cables.
- Never push objects of any kind into or through cabinet slots. They may touch dangerous voltage points or short out parts resulting in a risk of fire or electrical shock.

- Do not attempt to service the device yourself. Refer all servicing to qualified service personnel.
- If the following conditions occur, unplug the device from the wall outlet and bring it to qualified service personnel for repair.
  - The power cord or plug has become damaged or frayed.
  - Liquid has been spilled into the device.
  - The device has been exposed to rain or water.
  - The device has been dropped, or the cabinet has been damaged.
  - The device exhibits a distinct change in performance, indicating a need for service.
  - The device does not operate normally when the operating instructions are followed.
- Only adjust those controls that are covered in the operating instructions. Improper adjustment of other controls may result in damage that will require extensive work by a qualified technician to repair.

### **Rack Mounting**

- Before working on the rack, make sure that the stabilizers are secured to the rack, extended to the floor, and that the full weight of the rack rests on the floor. Install front and side stabilizers on a single rack or front stabilizers for joined multiple racks before working on the rack.
- Always load the rack from the bottom up, and load the heaviest item in the rack first.
- Make sure that the rack is level and stable before extending a device from the rack.
- Use caution when pressing the device rail release latches and sliding a device into or out of a rack; the slide rails can pinch your fingers.
- After a device is inserted into the rack, carefully extend the rail into a locking position, and then slide the device into the rack.
- Do not overload the AC supply branch circuit that provides power to the rack. The total rack load should not exceed 80 percent of the branch circuit rating.
- Make sure that all equipment used on the rack including power strips and other electrical connectors – is properly grounded.
- Ensure that proper airflow is provided to devices in the rack.
- Ensure that the operating ambient temperature of the rack environment does not exceed the maximum ambient temperature specified for the equipment by the manufacturer.
- Do not step on or stand on any device when servicing other devices in a rack.
